- The department of Rural Development Science began its modest mission in 1973 with the introduction of undergraduate course in Rural Development. The department was started with a vision to empower the rural poor students for an integrated human resource development.
- In the midst of innumerable academic programmes offered by ever growing number of academic institutions, an unique academic programme titled "Rural Development Science" is offered by Arul Anandar College (Autonomous). The College is affiliated to Madurai Kamaraj University and assumes greater importance due to its multi-disciplinary features.
- The base of this academic programme was built by Rev. Fr. S. Rajanayagam S.J., and Dr.S.Jeyaraj, Former Vice Chancellor, TNAU. It was constructed on a firm but radical pedagogic principle of "University towards Villages".
- The pioneering endeavour in the academic programme was duly recognized by both the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission (vide letter No.80263/G1/76-12 dated 23.09.1977 and the Union Public Service Commission (vide letter No.F.1/17/76-E.II, dated 2nd August 1976)
- The Department was elevated to PG level (M.Sc., RD), in the year 1983. The P.G programme was restructured and modified as M.Sc. Dairy Science and Rural Management(DS&RM) from the academic year 2014 15.
- This was done with the aim of widening the job opportunities for the students of DS & RM. Conception and Concretization of Rural Development Science as an academic programme is nothing but the commitment of this institution in building a strong and vibrant nation.

SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES IN UG PROGRAMME



Village camp is a "live in experience programme" of the IRD practical in the I semester. It is one of the mandatory exercises for the students that provide opportunity to interact with villages and enhances Reciprocal learning from rural communities.





Internship Training is one of the essential components in B.Sc Rural Development Science programme. It is offered to the III B.Sc students during sixth semester to equip them with professional knowledge and skills as it paves way for employment opportunities. Internship is part and parcel of the Integrated Rural Development (IRD) practical in the sixth semester and also a partial requirement for completion of B.Sc., RDS programme.

The main aim of the Internship Training is to interrelate the theory with practice to make them as 'Rural Development Personnel'. It gives practical skills and professional training in the fields of NGO Management, Agricultural Science and Animal Husbandry.



Postgraduate Programme in Dairy Science and Rural Management - Msc., DS&RM

The B.Sc.RDS Course was elevated to M.Sc.RD in 1983. The P.G programme was restructured and renamed as M.Sc. Dairy Science and Rural Management from the academic year 2014 – 15.

The objectives of PG course on Dairy Science and Rural Management are as follows

- To enable the students to understand the principles, the functions and the process of Rural Management
- To enable the students to carry out scientific, social and experimental research
- To make them acquire entrepreneurial skills to manage cottage, small and large scale industrial units
- To impart advanced knowledge on techniques of dairy technology, dairy products production and marketing
- To promote aptitude for relevant research in Rural Development

Summer Block Placement

Block Placement Programme is one of the important components of the Post Graduate programme in M.Sc., Dairy Science and Rural Management. It is a separate programme in the Second Semester which will be done during the month of April and May. It is a partial requirement for the completion of the PG Course. Two (2) credits are allotted for this programme. The Block Placement Programme aims at Skill Oriented Training of the students in the field of Dairy Science and Rural Management.

The programme aims to make the students as Personnel based on the theoretical and practical knowledge they acquired in the class room/lab/field. The students may be placed in any one of the industries/ institutions/ agencies related to the subject areas taught in Dairy Science and Rural Management.

PG PROJECT WORK

Project work is an important and mandatory part of the Post Graduate programme in M.Sc. Dairy Science and Rural Management. It aims at initiation of research thirst in the minds of Post Graduate students in the field of Dairy Science and Rural Management during their IV semester. The project work dissertation submission is a partial requirement for the completion of PG programme. 12 hours per week are allotted for the project work with 5 credits. The students may choose any research topic related to the subjects taught in the PG programme i.e. Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Rural Management.


