Following this motto, AAC strives to bring about social transformation, in the rural neighbourhood through its ideal of loving service flowing from the humanity of Jesus Christ.

The colours Gold, Blue and Maroon stand for the ideals of Work, Justice and Love contained in the motto. Arul Anandar College professes a philosophy of hard work coupled with a passion for truth, justice and love especially of the marginalized.

OUR FOUNDER: ST IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA

St Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Society of Jesus was born in Spain in 1491 in a noble family. While undergoing treatment for an injury sustained in the battle at Pamplona,



he read the Gospel and the Lives of Saints, that changed his life. Later he studied Philosophy and Theology and was ordained a priest in 1537. With a band of a few well-educated friends, he laid the foundation of the **Society of Jesus** in 1540. *The Spiritual Exercises* and *The Constitutions of the Society of Jesus* are two of his legacy to the Jesuits and the world at large. The former helps to reflect on God, Self, and the relevance of the mission of Jesus Christ to the world inviting every one to become woman and man for others; and, the latter contains the rules and regulations for the governance of the Society of Jesus.

OUR PATRON: ST ARUL ANANDAR



St Arul Anandar (St John de Britto), is the Patron of our college. Born in Lisbon in 1647 in a wealthy and aristocratic family and brought up in a rich and royal atmosphere, he became a Jesuit and volunteered to come to India in September 1673. He is one of the many Jesuit Missionaries who worked in the

Madurai Mission, India. Brilliant and young Britto was offered a professorial chair at a college in Goa but he preferred to come to Madurai and work in the interior villages. Between 1675 and 1687 he dressed himself as an Indian *sannyasi* (*Pandaraswamy*). He was known as *Arulanandarsamy*, eating only vegetarian food on plantain leaf, and squatting on the floor for study and teaching. He entered the kingdom of the Maravas, the present Ramanathapuram and Sivagangai districts and began his work there. Great opposition, resistance and persecution were his rewards, which he faced with a gentle smile. He had the courage to condemn

the wrong doings of both the mighty and the lowly. The conversion of Prince Thadiya Thevar incensed his enemies to persecute him and he was beheaded at Oriyur on February 4, 1693. His very name 'Arul Anandar' means one who is filled with the grace and joy of the Lord which he manifested by his service to humanity and perseverance in suffering. He continues to inspire all through his dedication, devotion and determination, exhibiting grace and joy.

Major Subjects are offered in all the six semesters in the following forms: as *core*, *core elective* and *allied*

Part IV

Non-Major Elective (NME) Courses

These courses are offered in Semester III and Semester IV by a department to students of other departments. A UG student should go through a maximum of two NME course, each carrying two credits.

A student of AAC who has passed Tamil in his / her twelfth standard and now **not** studying Tamil under Part I should study *Advanced Tamil* in Semester III & Semester IV.

A student who has not studied Tamil till now should necessarily study *Basic Tamil* in Semester III & Semester IV.

Skill-Based Elective (SBE) Courses

A student should go through for two semesters during the course of his UG studies, a Skill-Based Elective Course spread through two semesters.

Foundation Courses

The Foundation Courses, compulsory for all, are offered one in each in the first four semesters.

However, in Semester IV, the Catholic Students attend the course *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. Others desirous of registering for the course on *Catechism of the Catholic Church* are required to apply to Fr Principal in a separate form duly signed by their parents/guardians.

Part V

Bridge Course

A *one-credit* introductory course in English during the first semester is offered outside the class hours

ARul Anandar Initiatives for Social Education (ARISE)

A *one-credit* extension programme outside the class hours and outside the campus is to be undertaken during the Semester III and Semester IV.

ARISE links *lab with land*. It signifies *Pattikattai Noki Palkalai Kalagam* (University to the Villages).

Established in 1995 by Rev. Dr Michael Dass D L SJ, this programme ARISE involves collaboration with Voluntary Organizations, Government officials and the local leaders. The initiatives provide an opportunity to the students to reach out to the people. With the knowledge and the skill gathered, the students are to animate people and help them to develop themselves by mobilizing the locally available resources.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

Among the several wings such as Army, Navy, Airwing, Armoured Squadron etc, our college has only Army unit. Our unit is called 7/14 Arul Anandar College and is attached to 14 (TN) BN NCC, Dindigul. A maximum of 120 students drawn from the three years, serve as members of our NCC unit. Thus, 40 students may get enrolled in to NCC every year.

Students may be part of the NCC programmes for maximum period of three years. At the end of the second year, he/she can participate at the *B* - *Certificate Examination* and at the end of the third year he can participate at the *C* - *Certificate Examination*.

To gain *two credits*, a student has to be in NCC for a minimum period of two years.

NCC provides opportunities to participate at several types of camps including the Republic Day Parade in New Delhi.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

To obtain *two credits*, a student has to carry-out during the first four semesters the several programmes as suggested by the programme-officer of the unit concerned. The programmes conducted in and through NSS are mainly development-oriented. They are designed in such a way to promote a sense of social concern. They aim at developing leadership qualities among the students.

NSS at AAC has six units, each headed by a programme-officer and all the units function under a co-ordinator. A maximum of 100 students can become members of each unit.

Awards are given by the Government and the University to the staff members and the students exhibiting excellent performance.

Physical Education (PE)

In collaboration with the Department of Physical Education of AAC, the Co-ordinator of Physical Education conducts a course on the

rules and regulations of atleast three games. The entire programme, including a two-day trekking venture lasts for 90 working days in the first four semesters. This programme carries *two credits*. A maximum of 90 students can become members from each year.

Youth Red Cross (YRC)

The Co-ordinator of the YRC essentially conducts health-related programmes such as First Aid Training, Gold Hour of Life-Saving Mission, Blood Donation, AIDS Awareness Programmes, Awareness on Organ Donation etc. This programme lasts for 90 working days in the first four semesters, and carries *two credits*. A maximum of 75 students can become members from each year.

ROTARACT

The Co-ordinator of the ROTARACT conducts programmes for the betterment of the society. Obtaining donations and suggestions from well-wishers, the ROTARACT members help the needy by provide to the most-deserving, the much required things for immediate use. They further participate at many awareness programmes such as Use of Helmet, Planting of Trees, Campaigning for Hygiene Maintenance etc. A maximum of 75 students can become members from each year. This programme lasts for 90 working days in the first four semesters, and carries two credits.

All India Catholic University Federation (AICUF)

The AICUF functions with the view to empowering all involved towards the liberation of the entire humanity, irrespective of caste, gender, language, belief etc. It offers opportunities to have critical awareness and analysis of the society and thus creating a deep and geniune concern for the oppressed and the marginalised. A maximum of 100 students can become members from each year. This programme lasts for 90 working days in the first four semesters, and carries *two credits*.

Nature Club (NC)

The Co-ordinator of the Nature Club organizes programmes such as Greening and Cleaning the Campus, Trekking, environmental exercises involving study of the resources available, emphasizing in the meanwhile the care to be taken in the utilization of the depletable resources. In the college campus, they seek to enforce the segregation of the waste, using four-coloured dust-bins, one for plastic, one for iron and glass materials, one for paper and the last for perishable items. A maximum of 60 students can become members from each year. This programme lasts for 90 working days in the first four semesters, and carries *two credits*.

Women Studies Centre (WSC)

Established in 2009, the WSC offers a two-credit Non-Major Elective titled *Introduction to Gender Studies* in Semester III to the UG Students. The WSC seeks to disseminate information relating to gender-based issues to women students.

SCHEME OF VALUATION

All the papers (UG / PG and Theory / Practical) carry an *Internal Component* and *External Component*, each having 100 marks.

The Passing Minimum:

For UG courses: 40% for external and 40% in the aggregate For PG courses: 45% for external and 50% in the aggregate

SUMMATIVE INTERNAL ASSESSMENT: UG COURSES

College-Organized Component

Two college-organized tests: each of $1^1/_2$ - hours duration, and each carrying **40** marks, thus, accounting for 80 marks.

Department-Organized Component

A test of the form such as Assignment, Quiz, Seminar etc. at the initiative of the course-teacher or of the department, carrying **20** marks.

END SEMESTER ASSESSMENT: UG COURSES

Theory: Question-Paper Setting

Part II Part III External Examiners set the question papers.

Part IV Respective Course-Teachers set the question papers.

Practical: The question paper is set by the External examiner and the Course Teacher jointly. Valuation also will be done jointly.

Valuation: Single valuation by the Course Teacher - Twenty per cent of the valued scripts are scrutinized by the Chairman.

NB-01: In case of more than one course teacher, the course-coordinator sets the question paper.

NB-02: Value Education is given through four courses, each in a semester. A student has to pass in the examination conducted for each paper. At the end of Semester-II and Semester-IV, The student gets a credit each. Thus value education gets two credits.

NB-03: Part V

Semester I - Bridge Course carries 1 credit

Semesters III & IV - ARISE carries 1 credit

Semesters I to IV - A student gets at the end of Semester-II and Semester-IV, a credit each as he / she fullfills the requirements of the following courses such as NCC, NSS, Physical Education, YRC, ROTARACT, AICUF, Nature Club. Thus, through participation at the Value Education programmes a student gets two credits.

Self Learning Courses: End semester examination only

The Course-Teacher sets the Question Paper and values the answer scripts. Each Self Learning Course carries three credits.

Transparency: UG Students have an opportunity to verify their answer scripts on a day assigned.

SUMMATIVE INTERNAL ASSESSMENT: PG COURSES College-Organized Component

Two college-organized tests: each of 2- hours duration, and each carrying **40** marks, thus, accounting for 80 marks.

Department-Organized Component

A test of the form such as Assignment, Quiz, Seminar etc. at the initiative of the course-teacher or of the department, carrying **20** marks.

END SEMESTER ASSESSMENT: PG COURSES

Theory: External Examiners set the question papers.

Practical: The question paper is set by the External examiner and the Course Teacher jointly. Valuation also will be done jointly.

Valuation: Double valuation, one by the external examiner and the other by the respective course teacher - The Chairman of the respective Board of Examiners consolidates the marks obtained.

Examinations

- At the stroke of first bell, students should move toward the exam hall.
- In case of late arrival, i.e., after the second bell, the students are to wait outside the hall till a exam-centre official permits them. No one is permitted to enter the hall after 30 minutes of the commencement of test or examination.
- 3. All students are to remain within the examination hall for the first two hours of the examination.
- 4. Students are permitted to bring only their hall tickets and the relevant documents permitted by the authorities.
- 5. No other material than the question paper can be taken out of the Examination Hall.
- 6. Students indulging in any malpractice such as bringing any book or portion of a book, manuscript or any matter of any description into the hall and entering into conversation in any form with another are subject to severe punishment as per the directives of the State Government and Madurai Kamaraj University.

Eligibility for Supplementary Examinations

- Supplementary Examinations are conducted in June every year to students who have failed to clear the papers within the assigned time.
- A UG student can take a maximum of only two papers of Semester VI and only one paper of the previous semesters (I to V).

- A PG student can take a maximum of only two papers of Semester IV *and* only one paper of any previous semesters (I to III).
- This does not apply to Practicals and Continuous Assessement Tests.

Career Oriented Courses (COCs)

The University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi, selected our college in 2005 to offer Career Oriented Courses it sponsores and encourages our College to conduct as many COCs as possible to provide skills to the students. Students are fecilitated to choose a COCs of their choice and equip themselves

Valuation

- i. Theory Examinations Paper I and Paper II carrying 100 marks each - The Course Teacher sets the question papers and values the answer-scripts.
- There will also be a *Practical Examination* for each course for 100 marks.

EXTENSION CENTRES RURAL ACTION, DEVELOPMENT AND RESEARCH (RADAR)

- v. Mentor's and student's records are maintained separately

RULES AND REGULATIONS

a. Admission

- Applicants to the degree courses should have completed 17 years and 6 months on the 15th day of July of the current year.
- ii. All admissions are provisional and are subject to the approval of the University.
- iii. The Principal reserves the right to cancel the admission of the provisionally-selected applicants at any time without assigning any reason.

b. Fees Regulation

- i. Students are to pay their college fees at the start of every semester.
- Students withdrawing from the college during the course of the year are required to pay the entire college fees and other fees of that year.
- iii. Students shall pay the examination fees, on or before the date announced in the college calendar.
- iv. Irrespective of the receipts of scholarships, all fees must be paid within the stipulated time.

c. Attendance

i. Students of AAC are to follow the norms and guidelines of Madurai Kamaraj University: Only those Students with attendance of 75% and more (i.e., 68 days and more) in a semester are permitted to write the examinations. Students with only 44 days of attendance have to repeat the semester. A student has to pay a *condonation fee*, when he/she lacks the required attendance.

- ii. Students are expected to attend classes everyday. A student may avail himself/herself of leave only for genuine reasons and after obtaining permission from the Vice-Principal.
- iii. Attendance of students is marked in a register by the respective teacher for every period.
- iv. Students are expected to check their attendance in the Intranet at the Digital Library. Attendance of students is available on the internet at the home page www.aactni.edu.in. In case of any discrepancy, they should meet within two days the Vice-Principal with the note from their Head of the Department.
 - v. A student who is absent for one period is marked absent for one period only. If he / she is absent for two periods on a day is marked absent for half a day. If he / she is absent for three periods on a day he / she is marked absent for the one full-day.
- vi. 75% attendance is a pre-requisite for;
 - a. Permission to write the Semester Exams
 - b. Award of Scholarships of any kind.
- vii. Warning-Letters are sent to the parents of the students who are irregular in attendance.

Other Duty Attendance

- i. Students participating at co-curricular and extra-curricular activities should obtain permission from the Vice-Principal through the respective authorities.
- ii. On their return, their leave-forms should be submitted to the Vice-Principal through proper channel.
- iii. A maximum of 15 days only per semester is permitted for a student on Other Duty Attendance.

d. Leave-Letter

- A leave-letter must be duly signed by parents / guardian / warden for genuine reasons well in advance with the prior approval of the HOD.
- In the case of unforeseen circumstances, a leave-letter must be submitted on the first day of the student returning to the class.

iii. Medical leave-letter must be submitted to the Vice-Principal along with a medical certificate.

e. General Discipline

- i. Students are to wear the Identity Card within the college campus and while representing our college elsewhere.
- ii. Talking in English in the college-premises is mandatory.
- iii. At the stroke of the first bell all students are to move towards the classroom and occupy their seats.
- iv. The students are expected to keep standing and observing silence during prayer.
- v. For Shift I: There is a short prayer at **8.25 am**, and teaching-learning process begins at **8.30 am**.
 - For Shift II: There is a short prayer at **1.25 pm**, and teaching-learning process begins at **1.30 pm**.

f. Conduct during Class Hours

- i. Students should remain standing as a teacher enters, and again as he / she leaves the classroom.
- ii. Only authorised persons can enter the classroom during working hours.
- iii. Students should avoid loitering on the verandahs, during class hours.
- iv. Students should move from one class to another without causing any inconvenience to others.
- v. Students should maintain dignity and decorum in all common gatherings.

g. Notice-Board

- i. Students are to go through daily, the information displayed on the notice-boards. Ignorance is not as an excuse.
- ii. Students are not to tamper any notice displayed by the authorities. No notice can be put up or no handbill can be circulated without the express permission of Fr Principal.

h. Dress Code

- Every student is expected to be in simple and modest formal dress. Girls are expected to be either in saree with sleeved blouse or churidar or salwar kameez with sleeved long kurtha and duppatta.
- ii. Boys are expected to come in shirt and full pair of pants. T-Shirt is not permitted.

i. Code of Relationship

While the College Administration is for fostering wholesome relationships in our campus among all its members, it expects everyone to take extra-care to scrupulously shun occasions and places involving meetings of members of complementary sexes that invite attention of the authorities.

j. Eco-Friendly Zone

Students are responsible to keep the campus clean. They should further keep the campus litter-free. Our campus is "Smoke-Free and Plastic-Free".

k. Code of Behaviour

- Use and possession of drinks and drugs imply immediate dismissal from the college.
- ii. Smoking in the campus (including the college hostel) is prohibited.
- iii. Under the Educational Rules of the Government, the Principal is vested with power to fine, to suspend and to expel those involved in anti-social activities.
- iv. Under the *Educational Rules of the Government* students resorting to ragging in any form within and outside the campus will be dismissed from the college.
- v. Decent conduct is expected of an AAC student both within and outside the college campus.
- vi. No AAC student shall be a member of any association or club without the express permission of the Principal.

- vii. Use of mobile phones is prohibited inside the college campus. Possession / use of camera cell phones within the campus will invite severe punishment.
- viii. Decency demands that students are not involved in any kind of wild, noisy and disturbing behaviour during celebrations.
 - ix. Racing the vehicles or use of vehicles with defective silencers are not permitted.
 - x. Students are to park their vehicles in the places earmarked.
 - xi. Written permission from Fr Principal is required to take tuition from a teacher of our college.
- xii. Students are not to disfigure identity cards of the college / train / bus. They are not to damage any college property.
- xiii. While commuting by bus, foot-board travel is to be avoided.
- xiv. Malpractice of any form should be avoided.
- xv. Students may invite speakers, guests inside the campus only with a written permission of the Principal.

m. Certificates

- Students are to collect Conduct Certificate, Bonafide Certificate and Transfer Certificate before 31st December of the calendar year, in which they have completed their Degree.
- ii. Duplicate of any certificate is issued at the cost of Rs.10/-, if the requisition letter is certified by a competent authority (District Divisional Officer or a Sub-Magistrate, or a Tahsildar or a Gazetted Officer).
- iii. Students can collect SSLC Certificates, Higher Secondary Mark Sheets and Other Certificates only at the end of the course. Students are advised to take as many photo-copies of certificates as they require.

n. Library

- i. Library is the Temple of Learning.
- ii. Absolute Silence is to be observed in the library.
- iii. Searching, issuing and returning any library material are done with the help of computers.
- iv. Working Hours for Library and Browsing Centre:8.30 am to 6.00 pm on all working days and on Saturdays
- v. Only with the identity card, a student can enter the library and borrow books.
- vi. All personal effects such as bags, tiffin-boxes, note-books etc. are to be left at the library-entrance in the place allotted for it.
- vii. Number of Books that could be borrowed at a time:

UG students - 3 PG students - 5 Research Scholars - 8 Teachers - 10

- viii. Reference Books such as dictionaries, year-books, encyclopaedia etc. will not be issued.
- ix. Library books are issued for a period of two weeks, and this period may be extended.
- x. Books borrowed should be returned on or before the due date indicated in the issue-slip of the book. An over-due fine of Re.1 per day will be charged.
- xi. Library officials are authorised to ask for the return of any book before the due date.
- xii. On receiving the Library books, library-users are to make known to the library-official any damage found in them. They are further to verify the book-pocket-card and accession-number to be the same.
- xiii. Library books and other materials are to be treated with care.
- xiv. Students are fined for any damage caused to the library materials.

o. To Parents

Parents / Guardians are requested to co-operate with college authorities in the formation of good character of their wards exhibited through regularity in their attendance, progress in their studies etc. They are further advised to meet HODs/ Vice-Principal especially during Parents-Teachers Meeting.

RECOGNITION AND UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE FEES
