Jesuits in Higher Education

The Society of Jesus, commonly known as the Jesuits, is a Roman Catholic religious order founded in 1540 by St. Ignatius of Loyola, a Spanish soldier-turned-priest. The Jesuits are known globally for their dedication to education, intellectual inquiry, character formation, and social transformation. With a presence in over 100 countries, the Jesuits run a wide network of schools, colleges, universities, and social institutions that have a reputation for excellence and integrity. Jesuit institutions aim to educate the whole person - intellectually, morally, spiritually, and socially. With over 200 higher education institutions worldwide, Jesuits have shaped some of the finest centers of learning. These institutions are grounded in the Ignatian values of reflection, discernment, cura personalis (care for the individual), and magis (striving for the greater good).

Jesuit Higher Education in India

The Jesuits came to India in 1542 with St. Francis Xavier, one of the founding members of the Society of Jesus. Since then, Jesuits in India have established a strong educational tradition that emphasizes academic excellence, value-based education, and a preferential option for the poor. Today, the Jesuits administer more than 60 colleges and 8 universities across India, serving students from all walks of life. Notable Jesuit institutions in India include St. Xavier's College (Mumbai & Kolkata), Loyola College, Loyola Institute of Business Administration (LIBA) (Chennai), St. Joseph's College (Tiruchirappalli), St. Xaviers College and St. Xaviers College of Education, Palayamkottai, Xavier University (Bhubaneswar) and XLRI, Jamshedpur

The Jesuit Educational Vision

Jesuit education is not only about acquiring knowledge but about transforming lives. It aims to produce men and women for others—individuals who are intellectually competent, socially responsible, morally upright, and deeply committed to justice.

St. Ignatius of Loyola and the Society of Jesus

St. Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556) was a Spanish nobleman and soldier from the Basque region. In 1521, while defending the fortress of Pamplona, he was seriously wounded. During his long recovery, he read religious texts that inspired a profound spiritual conversion. He renounced his former life of glory and chose to dedicate himself wholly to God. Desiring to serve Christ more deeply, Ignatius traveled, fasted, and spent time in prayer and penance. He later studied at the University of Paris, where he gathered a small group of companions who shared his vision. In 1537, Ignatius and his companions were ordained as priests in Venice. In 1540, Pope Paul III officially approved their new religious order-the Society of Jesus, also known as the Jesuits. Their mission was to serve "for the Greater Glory of God" through education, missionary work, and pastoral ministry. Ignatius became the first Superior General and led the Jesuits with clarity, courage, and compassion. St. Ignatius authored the Spiritual Exercises, a powerful guide to prayer, reflection, and discernment, which remains central to Jesuit formation and retreats today. He also wrote the Constitutions of the Society of Jesus, a document that shaped the Jesuits into a well-organized, global missionary order with a strong focus on obedience, adaptability, and apostolic service. Ignatius died in 1556, but his legacy lives on. Today, the Jesuits are one of the largest and most influential Catholic religious orders, known for their excellence in education, spiritual guidance, and commitment to justice, with a strong presence in India and around the world.

Our Patron: St Arul Anandar

St. Arul Anandar/St. John de Britto (1647–1693) was a Portuguese Jesuit missionary and Catholic martyr, whose life stands as a profound symbol of faith, cultural respect, and social justice. He was born in Lisbon, Portugal, into an aristocratic family closely associated with the royal court. Despite being raised in luxury, John was deeply religious from a young age. At the age of 15, he entered the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), inspired by the courage and sacrifice of missionaries like St. Francis Xavier. Against the wishes of his noble family, he chose a life of simplicity and service. After rigorous formation, he was sent as a missionary to India in 1673. Assigned to the Madurai Mission in Tamil Nadu, he adopted the dress and discipline of an Indian sanyasi (ascetic), and was respectfully called "Pandarasamy" by the local people. To fully identify with those he served, especially the poor and the downtrodden, he took the Tamil name "Arul Anandar," meaning "man of divine grace." His deep inculturation, compassionate ministry, and bold preaching won many hearts but also provoked opposition from local rulers. In 1693, he was arrested and beheaded at Orivur in Ramanathapuram district for refusing to renounce his faith. He was canonized in 1947 by Pope Pius XII. St. John de Britto's legacy continues to inspire Jesuit institutions, especially in South India, where he is honoured as a model of incarnational service, cultural sensitivity, and unwavering commitment to the marginalized.

Brief History of AAC

Arul Anandar College (AAC), located in Karumathur, Madurai District, was founded in 1970 as De La Salle College by the Late Most Rev. Justin Diraviam, then Archbishop of the Madurai Diocese. It was established to bring quality higher education to rural youth, especially the underprivileged. In 1972, the College was renamed as Arul Anandar College after the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) took over the administration of the college, ushering in a new era of academic excellence and social commitment.

The college began with a Pre-University Course and undergraduate programs in Economics and Philosophy. Over time, it expanded significantly and today offers 17 undergraduate, 5 postgraduate programmes and 5 Departments are full-fledged research Centers. It is affiliated to Madurai Kamaraj University and has been enjoying the autonomous status since 1987, allowing flexibility in academic programs and innovation in teaching.

AAC's growth has been marked by a strong commitment to its motto—"Work, Justice, and Love." These values are reflected in its academic rigour, inclusive policies, and outreach activities. The college has successfully undergone four NAAC accreditation cycles, earning 5-star status in the first, 'A' grade with a CGPA of 3.52 in the second cycle and an impressive 'A' grade with a CGPA of 3.66 in the third cycle. In the fourth cycle it was reaccredited at "A" grade with a CGPA of 3.15.

In 2016, AAC was awarded the DST-FIST grant, enhancing its scientific infrastructure. It also offers value addition courses to equip students with skills for employment and ethical leadership. AAC's extension centers, RADAR and ARISE, work actively in the surrounding villages, promoting development, education, and empowerment.

Today, Arul Anandar College continues to be a transformative force in rural education, guided by Jesuit ideals and the enduring values of Work, Justice, and Love.



SALIENT FEATURES OF ARUL ANANDAR COLLEGE

Autonomy and Its Implications – Autonomy in Indian higher education allows institutions to design flexible, relevant academic programs. In 1987, Arul Anandar College became one of the first rural colleges in Tamil Nadu to gain autonomous status from the UGC, affiliated with Madurai Kamaraj University. This enabled the college to design its own skill-based, socially relevant syllabus and adopt innovative, interdisciplinary teaching methods. With autonomy, the college implemented timely evaluations, introduced the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS), and launched joboriented courses. It also fostered quality assurance through self-evaluation and accountability, paving the way for NAAC accreditation. Autonomy empowers the college to meet evolving academic and community needs.

Introduction of CBCS System – Arul Anandar College introduced the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in 2003 for the undergraduate aided stream and extended it to all programmes by 2008, following UGC and Tamil Nadu Government guidelines. CBCS promotes academic flexibility, interdisciplinary learning, and student engagement. It allows students to choose core elective, and skill-based courses across disciplines, with credits assigned based on learning hours and outcomes. The system emphasizes continuous internal assessment through assignments and presentations, replacing the rigid marks-based approach with a grade-based evaluation (GPA/CGPA). CBCS fosters self-directed learning, enhances employability through skill-based courses, and reflects the college's inclusive academic vision.

Introduction of Outcome-Based Education (OBE) – Arul Anandar College implemented the Outcome-Based Education (OBE) framework to improve the quality and relevance of higher education, following UGC and TANSCHE guidelines. Introduced for undergraduate programmes in 2019–2020 and postgraduate programmes in 2020–2021. OBE shifts the focus from teaching to measurable student outcomes. It ensures that curricula, teaching methods, and assessments align with specific learning goals. Key components include Programme Educational Objectives (PEOs), Programme Outcomes (Pos), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs), and Course Outcomes (COs). Continuous assessment and outcome mapping ensure quality enhancement. OBE prepares students for careers, higher studies, and societal contributions through structured,

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Admission Regulations

- 1. The applicant must have completed 17 years of age on or before the 15th day of July of the current academic year.
- 2. All admissions are provisional and subject to the approval of the affiliating University.
- 3. The Principal reserves the right to cancel the admission of any provisionally selected candidate without prior notice if found ineligible or in violation of admission norms.

2. Fees Regulations

- 1. Students must pay the college fees before the due date at the beginning of each semester.
- 2. Students withdrawing from the college at any point during the academic year must pay the entire college fees for that year.

3. Attendance Regulations

- 1. Students are required to attend all classes regularly and punctually.
- 2. The staff in charge will take attendance in the beginning of each class. Student not in the class room at the time of attendance will be marked as absent
- 3. Late comers must get an admission slip from the Vice Principal or an authorised person before entering the class.
- 4. Attendance to all Common College Programmes and functions is Compulsory.

4. Leave of Absence

- 1. Attendance at Tests and Examinations is Compulsory
- 2. Students who wish to avail leave must obtain prior permission from the Head of the Department (HoD). Leave without prior approval will be considered unauthorized.
- 3. In case of medical leave, students are required to submit a medical certificate issued by a certified medical practitioner. The certificate must be submitted immediately upon returning to the college.

4. Unauthorised Leave/Continuous Leave for a period of 15 days without the approval of the college authorities will lead to disciplinary action/removal from the Roll.

5. Condonation

- 1. Students must have a minimum of 75% attendance in each course to be eligible to appear for the semester examinations.
- 2. Students with attendance of 74% to 51% may appear for the examination only upon payment of a condonation fee. The decision of the Principal is final.
- 3. Students with 50% attendance or less will not be permitted to write the examinations under any circumstances.

6. On Duty (OD) Attendance:

- 1. On Duty concession is granted to students representing the institution in academic or extracurricular activities.
- 2. Prior written permission must be obtained from the Vice Principal, routed through the HoD or Coordinator.
- 3. On return, supporting documents must be submitted to the concerned authorities.
- 4. Students are allowed a maximum of 15 days of On Duty leave in an academic year.

7. Code of Conduct

- 1. Students are expected to follow all the rules and regulations as laid down in the College Calendar
- 2. Students must report to college on time and attend all academic and co-curricular sessions punctually.
- 3. It is mandatory to always wear the college Identity Card visibly while on campus. They must bring the College Calendar every day.
- 4. Students must maintain dignity and decorum during all common functions, assemblies, and meetings.
- 5. All students must stand respectfully for prayer at the beginning of each class session.

- Students are expected to check the college notice board daily to stay informed of all official notifications and updates.
- 7. Students are expected to wear neat, modest and formal clothes. Girls are expected to wear sarees with full sleeved blouses, Churdidar, Salwar Kameez with Dupattta. Leggings are strictly prohibited. Boys are expected to wear formal shirts and Pants. T shirts and Jeans are strictly prohibited. Students must maintain a neat, well-groomed appearance and hair style.
- 8. Smoking, possession or use of alcohol or narcotic drugs is strictly prohibited. Violators will face severe disciplinary action and may be handed over to the police.
- 9. Students engaging in antisocial or criminal activities, either inside or outside the campus, are liable to be suspended or expelled.
- 10. Students should not post any unauthentic statements /information about the College/Faculty/Students on Social Media or Websites. Violation of this will lead to severe punishment, including dismissal from the College.
- 11. Students are not permitted to give interviews/publish news articles/participate in any modelling shows/radio or television shows with out the prior permission of the Principal.
- 12. Protests/Strikes on campus by students is banned. Students participating in them are liable to be suspended/dismissed from the College. Any grievance may be reported to the grievance redressal cell.
- 13. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited and punishable under law as per the directives of UGC and the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act.
- 14. Use of mobile phones in classrooms, libraries, and during academic sessions is strictly restricted. Unauthorized use may lead to confiscation and disciplinary action.

- 15. Noisy, distracting, or disrespectful behaviour during assemblies, cultural events, and meetings will invite strict disciplinary measures.
- 16. Students must not become members of any external political, religious, or social organisation without the prior written permission of the Principal.
- 17. All students commuting by two-wheelers must wear helmets for their own safety and as per government regulations.
- 18. Communication between students of the opposite sex should be conducted with mutual respect, courtesy, and appropriate boundaries. Any behaviour that is deemed improper, intimate, or disruptive to the academic environment will invite strict disciplinary action.

Library

- 1. The library functions from 8:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on all working days. Students are encouraged to make the best use of library resources during these hours.
- 2. The library is a quiet zone for reading and study. Silence must be strictly maintained at all times.
- 3. Students must carry their Identity Card and produce it when borrowing books or using library services.
- Borrowing limits are as follows: Undergraduate students: Up to 3 books, Postgraduate students: Up to 5 books, Research scholars: Up to 8 books, Faculty members: Up to 10 books
- 4. Books may be borrowed for a specific loan period determined by the College and must be returned on or before the due date.
- 5. A fine will be levied for the late return of books as per library rules.
- 6. Books must be handled with care. Marking, underlining, tearing pages, or damaging books is strictly prohibited and will attract penalty or replacement charges.

- 7. Reference books, rare books, journals, and periodicals are for library use only and cannot be taken out without special permission.
- 8. Mobile phones must be switched off or kept on silent mode within the library premises.
- Personal belongings such as bags, books not belonging to the library, and food items are not allowed inside the library.
- 10. Library computers and internet facilities are to be used strictly for academic purposes. Misuse will result in disciplinary action.
- 11. Students are expected to follow all instructions issued by the Librarian and maintain discipline in the library at all times.

Office Staff Availability for Student Services

Students may meet the office staff for their academic and administrative requirements during the following time slots:

Shift 1-2:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Shift II - 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Students are expected to approach the office only during the above-mentioned hours for matters related to admissions, certificates, ID cards, scholarships, fees, and other student-related services.

Certificates

Upon completion of their course, students are required to collect their Conduct Certificate, Transfer Certificate, and other related documents such as SSLC and HSC certificates on or before the 31st of December of the calendar year in which they complete their programme.

Duplicate certificates issued by the College will be provided only upon payment of the prescribed fee and submission of a formal request.

Students are advised to collect their original certificates promptly and maintain them safely, as the College does not retain them beyond the stipulated period.

Examinations

The **Office of the Controller of Examinations (CoE)** at Arul Anandar College is responsible for ensuring the smooth and credible conduct of academic assessments. The college follows a continuous and comprehensive evaluation model, combining both Formative (CIA) and Summative (End-Semester) components under the autonomous framework.

Credit Requirement for UG and PG Programmes

To successfully complete an Undergraduate (UG) degree, a student must earn a minimum of 142 credits, For a Postgraduate (PG) degree, a minimum of 91 credits is required (TANSCHE-2025-26 onwards).

Assessment Structure: UG and PG

Each course carries a total of **100 marks**, comprising:

- Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA): 100 marks (converted to 50 marks)
- Semester Examination: 100 marks (converted to 50 marks)

The CIA component supports ongoing learning and internal feedback.

Part IV and Part V Courses: Evaluation

In the academic structure of Arul Anandar College, certain courses are classified under Part IV and Part V of the curriculum. These components are designed to complement core academic learning and contribute to the holistic development of students.

Part IV Courses

Part IV includes the following types of courses, Foundation Courses, Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), Non-Major Elective (NME) Courses, Bridge Course and ARISE.

These courses are evaluated entirely through Internal Assessment. The evaluation methods may include: Assignments, Quizzes, Class Presentations, Projects, Seminars.

Part V Courses

Part V comprises Extension Activities, such as NSS, NCC, YRC, ROTARACT, AICUF, Physical Education and Nature Club. Civic Engagement programmes that encourage community service and value-based learning. These are also assessed internally, based on participation, performance, and completion of assigned activities.

Semester Examination - Question Paper Setting and Valuation

For both UG and PG programmes, the Semester Examination Question Papers are set by an external course expert. This ensures academic integrity, diversity and standardisation across the evaluation process.

Valuation for UG Courses

The valuation of UG answer scripts is done by the course teacher who handle the subject. To ensure quality and accuracy, 20% of the valued answer scripts are scrutinised by the Head of the Department (HoD). This review helps maintain consistency and fairness in the assessment.

Valuation for PG Courses

For PG programmes, a double valuation system is followed. The answer scripts are valued independently by the course teacher and an external examiner. If there is a significant difference between the two marks (15 marks), a third valuation may be conducted.

Results

The results of the Semester Examinations are officially declared after the Awards Committee Meeting (Within 15 days from the last date of the Semester Examinations).

Transparency

As part of its commitment to transparency and academic integrity, the institution follows a best practice that allows students to go through their valued answer scripts after evaluation. This initiative ensures that students have the opportunity to verify the marks awarded to them and check for any discrepancies. If any issues are found, students can bring them to the notice of the concerned faculty or the Head of the Department for review and appropriate redressal. This practice not only promotes fairness in the evaluation process but also builds trust and accountability between students and the academic system.

Arrear Examinations

Arrear Examinations are held every semester according to the Rules and Regulations of the Examinations

Norms for Revaluation

A candidate can apply for revaluation in the prescribed format within a stipulated time to the Controller of Examinations along with the payment of the prescribed fee. A student can apply for three papers of the current semester provided they have failed or got less marks in the concerned course. This facility is available only for current students.

Supplementary Examinations

Supplementary Examinations are conducted for students in the month of June/July only for the Outgoing UG/PG Students and for those who have arrears only in the final Semester Examination.

Time Limit for Completion of UG/PG Degree

The Academic Council permits UG students to complete their UG Degree Programme in (3+3) years and PG Degree Programme in (2+2) years.

Malpractice

Students who indulge in any form of malpractice during examinations will be dealt with strictly in accordance with the rules and regulations outlined in the Examinations Manual. Such actions undermine academic integrity and are considered serious offenses. Appropriate disciplinary measures will be taken based on the nature and severity of the malpractice, as per institutional policy.

Examination Guidelines

- 1. Students must have a minimum of 75% attendance in each course to be eligible for the Semester Examinations.
- 2. Examination fees must be paid on or before the stipulated deadline announced by the Controller of Examinations.
- The Examination Time Table and Seating Arrangements will be displayed on the notice board well in advance. Students must check and note their schedule and hall correctly.
- 4. Students must report to the examination room at least 10 minutes before the commencement of the examination. Entry will not be permitted after 30 minutes from the start of the exam.

- 5. Students must carry their Hall Ticket, College ID Card, and required stationery (pen, calculator, etc.) for each examination. Students who forget the Hall Ticket or ID Card must report to the Office of the Controller of Examinations to obtain a duplicate valid only for that specific exam.
- 6. Students must occupy only their allotted seat as per the seating chart and maintain proper decorum throughout the examination.
- 7. Complete silence must be observed in the examination hall. Any form of communication, disturbance, or misconduct is strictly prohibited.
- 8. Students must ensure that their answer scripts are signed by the invigilator during the examination.
- 9. No student shall leave the examination hall within the first one hour of the exam duration.
- 10. On receiving the question paper, students must verify the Course Title, Course Code, and other details. Any discrepancy must be reported to the invigilator immediately.
- 11. All students must sign the attendance sheet circulated by the invigilator during the examination.
- 12. The use of unfair means such as copying, impersonation, or possession of unauthorized materials will lead to strict disciplinary action, including cancellation of the examination, suspension, or expulsion, as per the Rules and Regulations of Examinations in AAC.
- 13. Electronic gadgets, including mobile phones, smart watches, Bluetooth devices, and unauthorized calculators, are strictly prohibited in the examination hall.
- 14. Students must use blue or black ink pens only. The use of correction fluids is discouraged.
- 15. Students must always follow the instructions of the invigilators and examination authorities and maintain the discipline and sanctity of the examination process.

STUDENT SUPPORT INITIATIVES

Bridge Course in English

The Bridge Course in English is designed to support students transitioning from vernacular medium to English medium instruction. It aims to bridge the language gap by strengthening basic language skills, vocabulary, grammar, and communication abilities. This course plays a crucial role in helping students gain confidence and navigate their academic journey with dexterity and ease.

The course is compulsory and carries 1 credit, ensuring that every student receives the foundational support needed to succeed in an English-speaking academic environment.

Mentor Care Programme

Every student (mentee) is assigned a mentor who monitors their academic progress, attendance, discipline, and overall behavior. The mentor provides continuous support and guidance throughout the academic journey. Regular updates are maintained in the Thozhan app, ensuring transparent communication between tudents, mentors, and departments for timely interventions and support.

Remedial Programmes

Students who fail in one or more courses are given academic support through structured remedial classes. These sessions are conducted after regular class hours, where the respective course teacher tutors the students. The objective is to help students grasp core concepts and successfully complete their academic requirements.

Campus Ministry

The Campus Ministry aims to inculcate spiritual values among students in a secular and inclusive manner. It fosters a sense of unity by celebrating festivals of all religions with faith and fervor. The ministry promotes moral growth, mutual respect, and a deeper understanding of diverse cultural and spiritual traditions.

Counselling Services

Professional counselling support is offered to address adolescent challenges, including emotional and behavioral issues. A trained counsellor handles concerns like truancy, academic stress, and risk of dropout. When necessary, students are referred to specialists for further assistance, ensuring their well-being and holistic development within the campus environment.

Bank Facilities

The college campus houses an Indian Overseas Bank (IOB) branch that caters to the financial needs of the management, staff, and students. It facilitates transactions related to scholarships, fees, and other services, ensuring safety and convenience. The bank operates from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on all working days.

Online Courses

Students are encouraged to enroll in online courses through platforms like MOOC, SWAYAM, and NPTEL as part of their self-learning. These government-supported platforms offer high-quality courses, especially useful at the postgraduate level, with many students participating actively. The initiative promotes independent learning and enhances academic and professional competencies.

Alumni Association

The Alumni Association strengthens the bond between former students, the current student body, and the institution. Celebrated annually on October 2 as Alumni Day, the association supports the college through skill-sharing, mentoring, and donations in cash and kind. It fosters a lifelong connection with the alma mater and encourages meaningful contributions.

Self-Learning Courses

Students are encouraged to take up Self-Learning Courses to earn additional credits beyond the prescribed minimum. These courses promote autonomous learning and are evaluated through Examinations conducted at the end of the semester.

Value Added Courses (VACs)

Value Added Courses (VACs) are conducted after regular class hours to help students hone specific skills that complement their academic programme. These courses aim to enhance the employability, technical proficiency, and practical knowledge of students in their respective fields.

VACs include a mix of internal and external evaluation components, and are delivered through lectures, hands-on training, and project-based learning. At the end of each course, students appear for a Certificate Examination. These courses were previously offered under the name Career Oriented Courses (COCs), but have since been upgraded in structure and renamed as Value Added Courses.

Upon successful completion, students are awarded a Certificate issued by the Institution, recognizing their participation and achievement in the course. This certificate adds value to their academic profile and enhances career prospects.

Career Guidance and Placement Cell

The Career Guidance and Placement Cell plays a vital role in preparing students for their future careers by providing career orientation, soft skills development, and placement training. It organizes both on-campus and off-campus recruitment drives, where reputed companies visit the college and offer placement opportunities. Motivational talks, workshops, and expert sessions are regularly conducted to enhance students' confidence and employability skills. The cell also guides students toward higher education avenues by providing information and support for competitive exams and admissions. Through its dedicated efforts, many students are successfully placed and pursue higher education in reputed institutions.

Student Service Centre

The Student Service Centre offers essential support services, including reprography, stationery, and binding facilities. It caters to students' academic needs by selling notebooks, records, pens, and other stationery items. The centre ensures convenience and accessibility, helping students manage their coursework and assignments efficiently within the campus.

Health Centre

The Health Centre, managed by the Alumni Association, provides basic healthcare services to students and people in the surrounding neighbourhood. It conducts regular health camps and awareness programmes. The centre offers treatment for minor illnesses and ensures immediate medical attention, promoting the well-being of the campus community.

Association Activities

Each department has an Association that conducts various programmes aimed at the holistic formation of students. These initiatives are designed to equip students with essential curricular and extra-curricular skills, fostering their academic, personal, and social growth. The activities of the Association aim to enrich students' learning experiences and prepare them to face future challenges with confidence and competence. The Association plans and organizes the following types of activities: Guest lectures and expert talks, Seminars, paper presentations, and symposiums, Skill development programmes. Cultural and literary competitions, Interdepartmental events, Social outreach and community engagement programmes, Career guidance and placement-related workshops.

Skill Development Training

Arul Anandar College has entered into a three-year Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with TUV Rheinland India, a subsidiary of TUV Rheinland, Germany, under Project AMBER- a joint initative of the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC), the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE), and the Generation India Foundation. Through this collaboration, specialized training programs are offered in Retail Sales Associate (Retail), Customer Care Executive (Telecom), and solar PV Instaler (Green Jobs). The initiative provides both training and placement opportunities to current students and alumni, equipping them with industry-relevant skills and enhancing employability in emerging sectors

EXTENSION PROGRAMMES

RADAR (Rural Action Development and Research)

RADAR is a distinctive outreach initiative of Arul Anandar College, aimed at empowering neighbourhood rural communities, with a special focus on women and women from marginalised backgrounds. Through its inclusive and skill-oriented approach, RADAR works to promote economic independence, digital literacy, and social upliftment. The centre offers training in basic computer education, tailoring and embroidery, and preparation for government typewriting examinations. These programmes are designed to equip participants with practical, income-generating skills, helping them build confidence and improve their livelihoods. By nurturing self-reliance and promoting capacity-building at the grassroots, RADAR stands as a model of community engagement and women empowerment.

VETEX (Veterinary Extension Programme)

VETEX is an outreach initiative of the Department of Rural Development Science (RDS) at Arul Anandar College, functioning since March 1, 1997. The programme is dedicated to providing veterinary services to animals in neighbouring rural communities, thereby addressing a crucial local need for accessible animal healthcare. VETEX also serves as a practical training platform for students, enabling them to gain hands-on experience in identifying common diseases in animals, as well as in procedures like castration, artificial insemination, and basic animal care techniques. The programme strengthens the college's commitment to community service while enriching students with field-level veterinary skills essential for rural development work.

ACPR (Arrupe Centre for Policy Research)

ACPR was established at Arul Anandar College during 2007–2008 to engage in research, policy advocacy, and field-based interventions in rural development and sustainable livelihoods. ACPR focuses on understanding and transforming rural communities through evidence-based research, grassroots training, and community mobilisation. The Centre conducts

training for panchayat leaders, farmers, and women especially SHGs, and supports the creation of rural databases, networking with NGOs, and capacity building in local governance and development planning. ACPR promotes the formation and strengthening of Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs) and facilitates value addition activities to improve rural income and entrepreneurship. It also offers a one-year Diploma Programme in Multimedia to enhance communication skills among rural stakeholders. In partners with the Commonwealth of Learning (COL), Canada

ARISE (Arul Anandar Initiatives for Social Education)

ARISE is a student-driven initiative that fosters community engagement by encouraging students to interact with people in nearby villages and understand their needs.
